UNIFORMS - The first Friday and the following Monday of each month are non-uniform days. This concession is made to enable students to have their uniforms cleaned and to keep them in good repair. Uniforms should be sent to the cleaners on Thursday evening to assure having them back on Monday evening.

On non-uniform days, boys should not wear jeans, levis, T-shirts, sneakers or gym shoes. Girls should not wear any type of dress or skirt that good taste would designate as unsuitable for school wear. We expect all of our students to dress modestly and to use good taste in the selection of their clothing. Parents should check the length of their daughters' dresses; they should see to it that students do not come to school in clothing which does not fulfill the above standards.

All students will be expected to wear uniform blazers beginning at 8:20 a.m., on Tuesday, November 7.
